


**Selecting a 'teacher-defined' activity** – To select a specific activity that has been set by the teacher, click here.






**Selecting a specific level** – SumDog also allows you to select specific difficulty levels. Each level includes a range of different types of questions (e.g. adding, dividing, fractions etc.). The higher the level, the harder the questions will be.

To select a specific level, first click here.




This will give you a list of levels, from 1-10. Click on the level that you want, and then go ahead and chose the game that you want to play. The questions will automatically be set to match the level that you selected:



**Selecting a specific topic** – SumDog also allows you to select a specific topic to focus on (e.g. adding, dividing, fractions etc.). To select a specific topic, first click here.




This will give you a list of different topics. Click on the topic that you want, and then go ahead and chose the game that you want to play.



Once you have selected a Topic you can also select a more specific skill (or skills) within that topic by clicking on the skills button.



Use the check-boxes to select the specific skills that you want to focus on (e.g. 2, 5 and 10 times tables). You can select as many as you want.



The bars next to each type of question show how much practice you have done on each. A blank bar means that you haven't answered any questions like this at all, through to green which shows that you have been able to answer these questions quickly and accurately.
